SENATOR CUDABACK: I got the point, Senator. Senator Quandahl.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Quandahl, do you understand all of the implications and ramifications of this amendment?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I understand as...I guess as well as I can understand all of the implications and ramifications of this amendment, the purpose behind the amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I'm not talking about the purpose behind. When you say, to the extent that you can, do you mean to the extent that with your knowledge of these things you can understand it, or that, given the amount of time you've had to consider it, you understand as much as you can within those time constraints?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: It's probably a combination of both. I mean I think that we all understand, and I've been around this Legislature (inaudible).

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, let me ask it a different way before my time runs out. Are there aspects of this bill, in terms of ramifications, which you may not understand?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I don't know if I don't understand them but, like I said, that \$10 million figure, that may turn out to be more, it may turn out to be less. And so I don't know what the end result, total effect, as far as a monetary effect (inaudible).

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Again, so my time won't run out, in conversing with Senator Bourne, you said this money which would be turned over to the Treasurer would be put in a discrete fund and held there separate and not commingled with any other of the Treasurer's money. Is that correct?
