SENATOR QUANDAHL: I'm not sure about that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So that's a ramification that you don't know. Neither do I.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: That would be correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If 50 percent of the people who have unclaimed property are not found, it means that 50 percent are. Isn't that true?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So we would be cutting off, perhaps, those 50 percent who could be found if we stick with that statistical figure that you gave. Is that true? If 50 percent are not, then 50 percent must be.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is that true?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: That's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So there's the possibility that people who may be found under the current state of the law may not be found in the shortened period of time that this bill proposes. Is that true or false?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I think that would be true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you want to cut those people off so that the state can get this money quicker.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I don't want to cut those people off. I'm just saying that statistically that 50 percent of those people just aren't found.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do...how long have you had this amendment in your possession?
