SENATOR QUANDAHL: This particular amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Since, I believe, last Thursday.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you didn't give a lot of time to studying or researching how it would plug into the existing law, did you?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: That's...not with respect to what you're talking about, no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll put my light on again. Thank you for your help, Senator Quandahl.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. We're discussing the amendment offered by Senator Quandahl, AM0917, to committee amendment, AM0863, to LB6117. Those wishing to speak: Senators Bourne, Aguilar, Stuhr, Beutler, Quandahl, Brown. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President. Members, I appreciate the discussion and, as indicated earlier, I yield my time to Senator Brown.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Thank you, Senator Bourne. I would like to respond to Senator Chambers, because I...Senator Chambers,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Did you wish to ask a question?

SENATOR BROWN: I will just respond to Senator Chambers. The way that I read the amendment, it doesn't transfer out to anywhere, and so there is a period of time that the State Treasurer will be actively seeking the people who can be found. I think that the 50 percent that was referred to is just an estimate, but I don't think that there's any way to know on property rights that are that old and somebody hasn't been located for a great period of time. But the individuals, the Nebraska individuals that are owed this money, finding them will
