SENATOR CUDABACK: Clear as a bell. Nothing.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. Speaker and members, once again, I think that the question becomes whether because this is kind of an unusual circumstance and an unusual amount of money, whether it should be handled in the same way that we currently handle all of our unclaimed property, whether it transfers automatically into the permanent school fund in kind of a lump sum, and whether, you know, what the impact is going to be in terms of knowing with these demutualizations how much the payout...the experiential history of the payout is going to be. But I think that by virtue of leaving it in the hands of the Appropriations Committee, as I understand the current amendment does, that we have legislative oversight as to how it would be dealt with. And so I would support the amendment. Thank you.
