sort out this mail. I'd like to just give you an example of the Department of Motor Vehicles. This agency alone has 103 different types of fees which go into 22 different funds. Currently, this agency does deposit their funds daily with the State Treasurer's Office so, again, I really want to know what the cost savings of this whole process would be. This agency has also developed a logical computer system to receipt and process these fees. It is actually believed that this process would result in more work for the agencies, and not less. Each day, this agency mail is sorted and distributed by nine o'clock, and I think that one of the important issues is that DMV's need original documents. Returning opened mail to the DMV leads to a host of other concerns, among them privacy, lost documents, commingling of documents. The DMV also estimates that 3.5 man-hour years of programming time would be needed just to modify their system, as well as an additional \$1 million, and that's only for one agency. I'd also like to just take a little time and look at the Department of Revenue. During the current fiscal year, 98 percent of all the funds that were received in the Treasurer's Office on...were received on the same day; 98 percent. So these funds are already being collected and accounted for. I just thought it would be interesting also...the Department of Revenue received 1,608,000 pieces of mail.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR STUHR: That's 115 tons of paper. And we're talking about moving all of this into one area. And this is only one agency that we're talking about. Also, in the Department of Revenue, state law and state court decisions require that the department must retain original. And again, we're back to those original documents. Each agency now has their own system. Again, I said I'm not against change. But things are working well for many of these agencies as they are. The Department of Revenue alone administers 27 different tax programs. These are only some of the reasons. I believe that the general principle of having central receipting and depositing system,...
