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planning process part of it, for the implementation, and so developing what it might look like for any agency. So the groups that have been spoken to, the university is probably the one that is the most interested and that we will probably proceed, on tuition initially, and then on tickets eventually. The time line wasn't correct to do the tickets for this coming year, but for next year they could probably do the tickets.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: How about other state agencies?

SENATOR BROWN: There have been conversations with some other state agencies. We believe that it would be important to have an agency that does licensing, where there is a complicated application process to demonstrate that the equipment can distinguish all of the appropriate boxes that would need to be checked, or places that would need to be signed. And there's negotiations going on about that. But once again, we're going to be looking at agencies that would volunteer. There has been a project that has been ongoing with Game and Parks to do their renewals for NEBRASKAland magazine, and transfer that information all automatically. And...but I think that it's going to be convincing agencies to participate, picking out those that are going to be the best demonstration of the complexities that we would need to address, because I think that there are some legitimate issues about how do you go about addressing the complexity of it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Are there steps or guidelines as we go along, so we know that this is working? Is this...are we looking at getting going within a year, six months?

SENATOR BROWN: The report...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Will we know a year from now whether some of these are...?

SENATOR BROWN: The report would come back to the Governor and the Legislature in September of next year.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Of '04.
