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SENATOR COMBS:      If it doesn't work, what's the problem? What harm have we caused if we try a demonstration project with an agency that's willing to do it, to see if it works or not? The only thing we have to gain is a possible program that could be extended to all agencies eventually over the course of several years, by giving it a chance to see if it works to start with. So I'd ask for your reconsideration if you've already decided no, or perhaps proposing some of your own amendments to address your concerns to make this bill work. And I ask for your vote on it, and support. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM:      Thank you, Senator Combs. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER:      Senator Brown, just a few questions, if I might. And I'm trying to feel my way through this too. Actually, several of my questions were asked by Senator Wehrbein. But in addition to those questions, would you reiterate why you think this would save money? I mean, getting money to the bank faster. In other states, they've clearly demonstrated that it does get money to the bank faster?

SPEAKER BROMM:      Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN:      Thank you. Yes, much faster. And even...we can get you the numbers of even one day's interest...

SENATOR BEUTLER:      What...yeah, I was just going to ask you. If you got all Nebraska money that comes in to the bank one day faster,...

SENATOR BROWN:      We can...

SENATOR BEUTLER:      ...on average, how much money is that?

SENATOR BROWN:      I would say that it's probably about \$1 million a year. But I'm just...

SENATOR BEUTLER:      How much?

SENATOR BROWN:      A million a year. And that's...but I'm just...that's off the top of my head, and it might be more than
