something that is not possibly already obsolete. We need the opportunity for moving money rapidly and efficiently. It lies with the adoption and the usage of truly electronic payments. In other words, to have payments come into the system in electronic form, if we're really talking about the future. I think Games and Parks is probably a good example of this, that they have instituted a paperless system for permits and licenses. This is the sort of future-looking system that I think that we should be investing in, not another \$500,000 on a machine. As was pointed out, that is written in the legislation, that the report comes back to the Legislature on September 1, recommendations, actually, from the Treasurer. And then on September 15, an additional \$500,000 is then transferred. I really do have also some questions that I'd like to address to Senator Brown.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Brown, would you yield to some questions?

SENATOR BROWN: Yes.

SENATOR STUHR: One of my concerns is actually that the first types of mail that will be handled through this centralized system, do we have any idea what percent of the mail that the agencies receive now actually contain checks?

SENATOR BROWN: I...no, I have no idea what that would be. I mean, but those...all the mail would...there would be a separate post office box for the different functions. And so all the mail would not be going through the centralized system.

SENATOR STUHR: But how would that be sorted out? Someone would have to sort that? Is that what you're having the Treasurer do?

SENATOR BROWN: No. The...if there's a separate post office box, let's say, for licenses...we'll use the Department of Health and Human Services. You would have a separate post office box for doctors' licenses, for nurses' licenses, and so it would be...in a batch, you would be processing all mail that included a check, as an application for a license, and it would be processed together.
