SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR STUHR: But that mail would have to be opened to determine that.

SENATOR BROWN: No. No. If...right now, if you do an application to be a...to renew your physician's license, you send it to a certain post office box at Health and Human Services. That post office box is going to be all licenses for doctors. And so everything that would be included in that post office box is going to be a license application that would include a check. And so that would be processed in one batch.

SENATOR STUHR: All right. That might be true maybe of Health and Human Services. But Department of Revenue, I know that...I believe one instance was given where they...

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR STUHR: ...might have different tax forms in the same envelope. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Stuhr and Senator Brown. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Senator Bromm, members. I'm really uncertain as to what to do here. I listened to Senator Combs' remarks, and they kind of hit home to me. I am kind of concerned with what I perceive as the Treasurer having bills introduced to expand her role here. And sometimes I think maybe people should concentrate on the duties that they have and do those duties well and let the rest of it take care of itself. But I'm trying to put that aside and determine whether or not this is the best idea. And I wondered if Senator Bromm would yield...or, Senator Brown. (Laugh) I'm following Senator Cudaback here today. Senator Brown, would you yield to a question or two?
