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something like this...this idea, this very idea has merit. And that's why I want to move this along, because I believe that we can look for efficiencies. And again, I emphasize the fact that this is not the original bill. And other states are practicing this already. It can be done. The confidentiality issues have been solved. And many, many, many things can take place with the demonstration project, and iron these things out. And yes, it's a bit of a change. And I'm not afraid of change, and that's why I think that we need to give a vote...vote green in the name of efficiency and streamlined government. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Brown. Senator Brown waives. Senator Connealy.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. Once again, I think this is too expensive for an experiment. I don't know if this will work unless the Department of Revenue is a part of it. And we haven't solved those confidentiality questions, and the questions of equipment that they have now. The Department of Revenue, on my understanding, does all this right now. They have the machines. I think it would be a lot more logical, if we do it, to have part of the administration run the demonstration project, if that's really what we want to do. I believe that the system won't work unless we use the Department of Revenue as part of the project. And they have the machinery in place. They're doing this job. They're turning over the money. The majority of our money goes out the same day into the bank from that right now. I see no reason for the Department of Revenue to come into this project. And if we don't do that, I don't think the project works. So, you know, we haven't solved the problem of security and confidentiality that is in the Department of Revenue now. I am going to be opposed to the bill.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Connealy. Senator Mines.

SENATOR MINES: Mr. Speaker, call the question on the amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question before us then is, shall debate cease? All in favor please vote aye, and opposed vote nay.
