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priority bill be debated. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Schrock a question, if I may.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, would you respond to a question from Senator Chambers?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, did you say that this is, in your opinion, this is not the time to put an additional burden on the farmers by way of the checkoff contained in this bill?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's what I said, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And do you still stick by that?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Give you one more chance. You mean it?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I don't think that now is the time to impose another half-cent tax on corn.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are farms located in the rural area?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, they are, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now if this was a city bill, I would be concerned about putting an additional tax on city people, but since rural people aren't worth anything anyway...oh, that's all I'll ask you because I don't want to make it seem like you're in cahoots with me on this. I had told my colleagues that when a bill comes out here and it relates to the rural people, don't tell me that I should show them any consideration because you already voted affirmatively that they ain't worth nothing.
