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amendment does right now, the amendment to the committee amendment.

SENATOR KRUSE: This amendment here strikes Section 9 on page 7, I think it is. And then on page 8, strikes 12 and 13.

SPEAKER BROMM: And the effect of striking that is what?

SENATOR KRUSE: That...removes penalties that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR KRUSE: ...Senator Chambers felt was too severe.

SPEAKER BROMM: I see. Okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Dwite Pedersen.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Senator Chambers was visiting just a little bit ago about driving on suspended licenses and people in prison. Just wanted to give you a number. We have right at 250 people today in our prison for driving on suspended licenses, and most of them because they had a third offense DUI and lost their license for 15 years. And most of them were not drunk when they got the third...when they got their driving on suspension. We are paying an average of \$22,000 a year for them, when they could be working on...using a lot less restrictions. I'll give the rest of my time to Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Pedersen. And Senator Bromm, I already mentioned that I'm situated where you are, and not having had time to thoroughly go over this bill. But the amendment that...what would be stricken by the amendment is a provision that would make driving under suspension a Class IV felony. Not driving drunk. If you had three DUIs and your license had been suspended, and then you're caught at any time during that 15 years driving under
