going to have to read to understand, if you can, that first element that you started trying to deal with. I haven't done it that way. I don't believe I'm going to do it that way, but I don't believe I would grasp everything in this bill if I did not do that. I think...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...this bill did not receive adequate work in the committee because we don't have a committee statement that explains to us what this bill is about because this bill is LB 775, and there is no committee statement for LB 775. This bill probably should be referred to a committee and that committee should be the Judiciary Committee because it's talking about crimes and punishments. But it certainly is not in condition to be moved across the board. And had I not promised that I wouldn't offer amendments on General File, whether you accepted the amendments or not, they would focus attention directly on problems that I see in the bill. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers, and Senator Erdman. Senator Baker, on the Kruse amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members. As to several issues here Senator Chambers has raised, there obviously was no committee statement on LB 775. The committee worked on this and combined it into LB 208 and moved it out, as Senator, I think, Dwite Pedersen mentioned. He did not vote because of interlock considerations. As far as work on it, there was days and days of work on this, back and forth, between prosecutors, legal counsel to the committee, Senator Kruse's staff, and so one, and I can understand possibly why Senator Chambers has concern. Because, to be honest with you, it was done, a lot of that work, by the Douglas County prosecutor and Sarpy County deputy prosecutor, I believe, who had a lot of expertise. They testified on at least... I don't have that either in front of me right now, but they testified on the bills and it was agreed to work with them, and they did over a period of time.
