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Synowiecki, and this will be your third time, Senator.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, and thank you, Senator Kruse. This has been most helpful for me in my endeavor to attempt to understand all the provisions of the bill. If you would engage one more time, Senator.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Kruse, would you yield?

SENATOR KRUSE: Yes.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Senator Chambers started a conversation about the new language, which I believe this is new language in your proposal...

SENATOR KRUSE: Yes.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: ...that requires county attorneys across the state to include in their indictment more information, previous drunk driving convictions.

SENATOR KRUSE: If they...if this...if they are not enhancing.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Oh, if they are not enhancing.

SENATOR KRUSE: Correct.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Oh, okay. Well, Senator Kruse, at time of charging, at time of charging, do you think the county attorneys would have all the information available to them with regard to the defendant's prior records with regard to DWIs at that time? I guess I'm afraid that some might slip through the cracks because of this, in the sense that at the time the information or at the time the complaint is filed, let's say, some other...let us say, some convictions of DWI are not uncovered, Senator,...

SENATOR KRUSE: Yes.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: ...but then as the process proceeds, there is discovered other convictions. Would this prevent enhancement
