whole discussion is helpful to draw up a new public consensus because far more important than the law that we're looking at here is how the public feels about alcohol-impaired drivers. In other countries, we don't have this kind of discussion. They never have it. They don't have to have it because people do not drive after being alcohol impaired. They don't do it. We've got a problem and I think that this amendment and the base amendment, the main amendment and the basic bill are those that will deal with the problem. I urge your support of the bill and its amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kruse. You've heard the closing on AM1053 to the committee amendments offered by the Transportation Committee to LB 208. The question before the body is, should that amendment be adopted? All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the Kruse amendment to the committee amendments to LB 208.
