coalition amendments, whatever, for Select File. We want to make this a good bill, and I welcome it from anybody. We will work with anyone on it. And the second point I would make is this is not a prosecution created bill. I have never said that or implied it, and I don't know of anybody else that has implied that. My staff began working on that over a year ago. My LA worked on it all last spring. I have been working on parts of this bill for ten years. Scott, the counsel for Transportation, worked on it last year. The new counsel has also done that. We have consulted with everybody in sight. So this is truly, as I said before, a Nebraska product and I hope we can make it better. I urge that you advance it...advance the bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kruse. You've heard the closing on advancement of LB 208 to E & R Initial. The question before the body is, should it advance? All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on advancement of LB 208 to E & R Initial. Have you all voted who care to? Voting on advancement of LB 208. Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal pages 1077-1078.)  
26 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 208.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 208 does advance to E & R Initial. Mr. Clerk, next agenda item.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 626, pursuant to Rule 6, Section 3(f), Senator Landis would move to indefinitely postpone the bill. Senator Preister, as principal introducer, you have the option to lay the bill over, Senator.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Mr. President. Please lay it over.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is laid over. So ordered. Mr. Clerk, next bill.
