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Kissel, Lynn Rex from the league, Paul O'Hara, and Les Meyer from Kinder Morgan. And when Paul speaks I think he...he, when he speaks, he has both of those clients. I didn't ask him which client was speaking when he was talking to me. Those are the parties that were trying to work this out.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Okay. And so that would include too, I didn't hear you mention, somebody from NorthWestern. Are they at the table also in this?

SENATOR LANDIS: We anticipate immediately, when the bill goes and we then have the draft, to start a process in which the conversation would include myself David Hecker on behalf of the league, probably Dan Crouchley, Andy Pollock from the PSC, probably Bud Becker from Kinder Morgan, Alan Dietrich from NorthWestern, and then representatives to sit and listen, including a representative on behalf of Aquila and the league.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Okay, because that...I guess my concern, if I could just kind of express that now, is that if we are going to have an agreement that's agreed to by all parties, that we truly do have all parties, which would include all of the investor-owned companies that do have a sizeable or even not so sizeable part of the customer base or the ratepayers in the state of Nebraska, because if we truly do want to create a fair and an equitable regulatory framework and this is granted, and I don't know if it's soaked into this body, but this is a radical, radical departure from where we are right now and where we're going to go in the event that LB 790 does become law. This is a brand new layer of bureaucracy that we are contemplating putting forth in the state of Nebraska for natural gas regulation in the state that's never been there before. And so I just want to make sure that if we are going to do that, that every single stakeholder, every single person, every single rate holder that has an interest in that process are represented in the negotiations, and so that's just what I think is necessary in order for something to be fair, to be equitable, and to be in the best interests of all Nebraskans. And so that is why I stand.
