SENATOR LANDIS: It's a good idea. Let's do it now. That's my closing. (Laughter)

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is adoption of the Landis amendment, AM1066, to the committee amendments, AM0809, to LB 790. All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. The question for the body is the Landis amendment, AM1066, to the committee amendments, offered by the Urban Affairs Committee, to LB 790. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Landis' amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: AM1066 was adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further to the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Back to discussion on the committee amendments themselves, Senator Hartnett. Senator Hartnett, did you wish to close or do you wish to speak?

SENATOR HARTNETT: I'll close if there's no other light.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You're recognized to close.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I appreciate Senator Quandahl's comments and so forth, because if we would have done this (laugh), tried to get LB 790 five years ago or a shorter period of time that, we've not been able to do it because I don't think the cities were ready to move that were regulated by investor-owned...were not ready to move on it. And so this time has come where we get in line with all the rest of the states. And I do appreciate Senator Landis' work on an issue that's been before the Natural Resources Committee for a number of years, and I simply ask for adoption of the committee amendments.
