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FLOOR DEBATE

March 28, 2003      LB 175, 186

SPEAKER BROMM:      The amendment is adopted.      Senator Mossey, you're recognized for a motion.

SENATOR MOSSEY:      Mr. Speaker, I move the advancement of LB 175 to E & R for engrossing.

SPEAKER BROMM:      You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. LB 175 is advanced. Mr. Clerk, any further motions on this bill?

CLERK:      Mr. President, Senator Chambers has an amendment. But I understand, Senator, you'd like to withdraw. I have nothing further on that bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BROMM:      Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Next item on the agenda.

CLERK:      Mr. President, LB 186. Senator Beutler, AM0350. I understand you want to withdraw that, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER.      That's right.

CLERK:      Mr. President, the second amendment, Senator Beutler, AM0349. Again, I understand you would like to withdraw that one, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER:      That's right.

CLERK:      Senator Beutler, AM0348. Again, a note to withdraw, Senator. Senator Beutler, I now have AM0824. Mr. President, Senator Beutler would move to return the bill for specific amendment, AM0824. (Legislative Journal page 1092.)

SPEAKER BROMM:      Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER:      Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this is the famous, or the infamous, junkyard bill, depending, I suppose, on your point of view. But Senator Baker and I have reached a compromise on it, and we're hoping that the compromise is agreeable to you. As you know, oversimplifying a little bit, Senator Baker wished to relieve the Department of Transportation
