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appreciate the sensitivity to that to ensure that there's representation from across the state on the TERC board, and I will support the amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Senator Wehrbein, if I could ask you a question and following what Senator Erdman had to say. Now, as I understand it, in order to serve, except at the at-large position, you would need to reside in the Congressional District that you're representing.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: To be appointed from, yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: And you would not, though, be able to receive any expenses from traveling, for traveling back and forth to that residence. Is that the case?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's the proposal here, yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: So I guess one question I have is suppose...you're allowed a second term on that, aren't you? You could be appointed for a second term as a commissioner?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I think so I can't tell you factually off the top of my head.

SENATOR RAIKES: So suppose you...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The answer is yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: .. you would need to maintain a residence in the district then, even if you needed to work in Lincoln? What I'm getting at, suppose you were a second term. Could you then be reappointed to represent, say, the 3rd District?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Because you're maintaining your residency there, yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, but what if you didn't? What if
