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since the underlying bill is his.

SENATOR LANDIS: And you're asking that he yield to a question, are you?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I am.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Tyson, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR TYSON: Yes, I would.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Tyson, this bill relates to a person who's going to apply for and try to receive a liquor license?

SENATOR TYSON: Yes,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR TYSON: ...among others.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now if I under...remember the liquor law correctly, and it hasn't been amended, a person seeking a liquor license must show himself or herself to have good moral character. Here is my question. What does having good moral character have to do with selling liquor, if you know?

SENATOR TYSON: I don't want this information to be bandied about, Senator Chambers, but I haven't the foggiest.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Neither do I. Thank you, Senator Tyson.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you for that exchange. Senator Brashear, I believe you have an amendment to the committee amendments, is that right? There are no other lights on. You're recognized to open on your amendment to the committee amendments. (AM1070, Legislative Journal page 1104.)
