I don't want to be repetitive, because she said it so well and so has everyone else. However, it is appalling to me. I work in two different places every day of the week. I work here, and I work at Farmland Foods meat packing plant. And I have to show my ID. And even though the guards have seen me come in and out there every day for seven years, they've got to look at my picture. That's their protocol. And I just...I'm glad to see that the State Patrol will be involved. And not to have any kind of a bad light shed at all on our present security system, but it does need to be tighter. And it's better to control the barn door before the cow gets out and we have to do things retrospectively to correct a bad situation. Let's be preventive and proactive, and certainly get on board with the rest of our country with the security measures. With that, I turn the rest of my time back to the Chair. Thank you.
