SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, if the current security force has no additional powers, how are they enhanced by being under the administration of the State Patrol?

SENATOR HUDKINS: Because the State Patrol will look at the current procedures, the current practices,...

SENATOR LANDIS: Time. Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Quandahl, Senator Chambers, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I was...I believe I've heard this bill before, when I was on the Government Committee. And I guess I'd preface that by saying that I'm all for having a secure State Capitol and work environs. I think that's something that's imperative that we provide. But when I looked at the amendments that we just adopted and then also the bill itself, my question...and I may have a question or two of Senator Hudkins. It would appear to me that what this bill does is just merely add, or shift, responsibility to another layer of bureaucracy, without any sort of guarantee or any sort of plan that I've heard yet this morning on how security or how...how security would be improved at the State Capitol or the grounds that are covered by this particular bill. If I heard Senator Hudkins correctly, she said that right now the current security people, there's no plans to get rid of the current security people, there's no plans to make any drastic changes in policy, there's no plans to change anything that's currently in place. My question is, if there aren't any plans to change anything, then why do we need to do it?

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Quandahl. Senator Chambers, followed by Senators Beutler and Friend.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senators Beutler and Quandahl touched on what I was thinking, but mine goes to an even deeper layer. If this bill is put in place, I don't want to see this place crawling with state troopers. I don't want to see metal detectors at the doors. I don't want to see Latinos, Native Americans, black people, and those who appear to be of Middle Eastern descent stopped,
