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because cops are notorious for being suspicious of people who are not white. I'm not at war, Senator Friend. Nebraska is not at war. And I think it is preposterous to try to get in the minds of people in Nebraska that somehow they're living at risk in this state. I know politicians like to jump on the bandwagon and be whatever...be a part of whatever is the going thing of the day. Senator Hudkins did not offer this bill as a response to September 11, 2001. I have seen no need to have more state troopers running around here. I'm the only one who was on this floor when somebody made some kind of threat from the balcony, and I didn't say put more state troopers up there. I didn't say start searching people at the door and treat everybody as though he or she is a criminal. What do you all have to be afraid of other than me? And when you talk about terrorism, what terrorism are you thinking of other than that which I wreak on this body? And I certainly am not going to have any trooper talking to or interrogating me or anybody who comes to my office. I know that's not the intent of the bill. But when we start standing on this floor, talking as though people are at risk when they come to this building, I think that is preposterous. I'm more worried about the lobbyists who can come in here and raid our numbers and run them all out to Las Vegas. That's not Osama bin Laden doing that. That's not Mullah Mohammed Omar. It's not even Saddam Hussein. If you ask him about that, he'd laugh and say, don't insult me, I don't care about the Nebraska Legislature. When was the last time Senator...I won't mention anybody by name...any senator was worried about Osama bin Laden setting down on the grounds of the Nebraska State Capitol Building to do anything? Who would waste the gasoline to fly a plane into this State Capitol Building? What are you all afraid of? It's just like all these people running around here so afraid of their neighbors that they want to carry guns. You don't see black people coming down here saying do that. You see white people, and especially from the rural and suburban areas, where they want to always talk about the high quality of life, how they help each other, they know each other, neighbors look out for each other. Yet you need to carry hidden guns to protect you from your neighbors? Now that I see this bill as others are seeing it, I'm opposed to it. Those who have tried to help the bill should have left those thoughts unsaid. I don't think this bill is going to move
