today, because I see an attitude and a spirit...not on the part of Senator Hudkins. Let me explain something. When I looked at this bill, even though I have concerns about people not losing their jobs, but that's something that could be addressed, I didn't even stay on the floor. What called me up here was Senator Friend's trumpeting about September 11 and we are at war. Well, I don't know who he's at war with, maybe Senator Suttle, ex-Senator Suttle. But when those comments are made on the floor, I am going to respond to them, and let you all know that what you say...

SENATOR LANDIS: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...doesn't apply to all of us. There is no war, in my mind, anyway. America has not declared war on anybody. So how can America be at war? What it's doing is illegal, unlawful aggression, in violation of international law and the UN Charter. Why don't you have the State Patrol do something about them? I am very offended when I hear those remarks on the floor. But I never tell anybody they don't have a right to make them. What I do is different from what my colleagues do. I don't sit in my office, swallow spit, and run around mumbling to other people. I come up on the floor where the remarks are made, and I respond to the remarks. Because this is a place where we should debate issues that relate to the public. And maybe it's good that this bill did come before us, because it offers us the opportunity to address the paranoia...

SENATOR LANDIS: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Beutler, followed by Senators Friend, Cudaback, Combs, Hudkins, Mossey, and Chambers.
