SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. Thank you, Mr. President and members. I need to clarify, I think, what the committee amendment did. And I apologize to you. I don't think, when I voted on it, I really understood what we were doing with the committee amendment. And that's a terrible admission to make, but it happens to all of us sooner or later. What the committee amendment really did, as I understand it now, is it transferred...it made clear that everything that the Department of Administrative Services oversees now in the way of security is just being transferred to the State Patrol, but that...and this is the part of the committee amendment...but that anything else across the state in the way of state buildings, et cetera, is not included under the bill. And so I think that when we were doing it...I thought we were actually winnowing down the scope of the bill. In essence, I think all we were doing was making clear that it didn't apply to any other buildings than the ones DAS already has charge of. And I want to just read from the fiscal note for you what those buildings are. They would include the Capitol, the Governor's Mansion, Ferguson House, Information Management Services Building, Nebraska State Office Building, the State Lab, Whitehall, TBS building, and parking facilities. In addition, the State Office Building provides contract security services to the Department of Roads building and the Game and Parks building and the Department of Labor building. It would be up to the State Patrol to decide if they wanted to provide that contract security, as I understand it now.
