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were and discovering the impacts that it was to be on the various agencies. I think we need to move ahead, and I am open and will work with anyone, as I have indicated, as Senator Preister and Senator Schimek and Senator Beutler, too, as far as that and the Program Evaluation, to see what we can do probably in amending the green copy at Select File. My concern is that this amendment at this point, the white copy that I would also encourage you to vote down, is a little more far-reaching than I think that we quite understand, at least is in my mind. Perhaps everyone else understands it better than I. But there are some things in here that has an impact that is not readily clear, I think. Some of it is in reaction to some communications that I've had recently. And I think some of you have had that too. I think that under those circumstances, it's better to move slowly on this and to continue to work with it on...towards Select File. Hopefully at this stage of debate we can understand better what's in the green copy and its implications, although it is pretty much in effect at this point. But to me, it's been a difficult thing to get my arms around. And I hope that this will help...that the whole body can understand better where we're headed and better what the proposed amendments will be. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, I'm not going to...I'm only going to speak once, and not very long, because obviously we're...nobody's going to be listening now because we're not going to do any work on the bill. But let me say that I'm disappointed that we're going back to the green copy. I think the green copy is unclear in certain respects, and certainly doesn't go far enough in terms of reforming the process of services contracts, from my personal perspective or the perspective of the Program Evaluation Committee which, as some of you know, did a performance audit in this area and had a large number of recommendations on how that...Program Evaluation, at least, felt the process could be improved. So rather than go into the details of what more can be done, I hope we plan to have that debate on Select File. And I hope there's some serious compromise envisioned before we get to Select File.
