SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. You've heard the opening on the committee amendment. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I'm asking for a division of the question on the committee amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There's been a request for a division of the question. Senator Brashear, as Chairman of the committee, Senator Tyson, as principal introducer, and Senator Chambers, why don't you come forward, and we'll work the division out. The issue before us is LB 265 and the AM0768 to that. It was asked for a division of the question. It was ruled divisible. Mr. Clerk, read how the committee amendments are divided, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, for purposes of discussion, let me just indicate that the first amendment that will be discussed is what will be FA1212. And that will consist of Sections 1, 2, 3, and 17. And rather than go through this list now, let me suggest to you that I'll prepare a handout that we'll provide copies of the membership during the course of the discussion on this first floor amendment. So the first amendment, Mr. President, will be a discussion of Sections 1, 2, 3, and 17. (Legislative Journal page 1111.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk, for that. Okay. The question was ruled divisible, and it was divided. Chairman of the Judiciary Committee, Kermit Brashear, will open on FA1212, which is 1, 2, 3, and 17. Senator Brashear to open.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, thank you, I think, (laugh) and members of the body. Section 1 names the Concealed Handgun Permit Act. Section 2 specifies that an individual may obtain a permit in accordance with the act. Section 3, contained within FA1212, has all of the definitions of the proposed act. And
