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one on what Senator Thompson said, because I think they need a different viewpoint. Senator Thompson had some figures and said that it was her belief, et cetera. Senator Thompson, think about it and then press your light again and we can discuss, if you wish, what your belief has to do with my right, or what my beliefs have to your rights. As to what Senator Schimek said, I certainly respect her right to differ and her reasons, but one I would take exception to...well, two. I think one has been discussed and that is the police attitude on this. The one I would take exception to is the one about age. When I was 19, not 21, 19, an uncle took me under his wing and gave me all sorts of courses of instructions. Then when I was 20, he sent me on a camping trip, and to make sure that I felt secure, he gave me a machine gun, called a M-3A1, and he told me that I could use it any place I wanted to, as long as I was on my duty station. Later on, I was able to trade that M-3A1, that I didn't think much of, for a 1918-A2, otherwise known as a BAR, because I had more respect for that weapon, and I was in the Air Force, I wasn't in the infantry. But there were shootings and right now we have a whole bunch of incorrigible people under 21 in Iraq. Some of those people under 21 have an astonishing array of weapons that I don't even begin to understand. Age is not the criteria. We have an age in here of 21 because of the age of maturity in the state of Nebraska. But it is attitude and sense of responsibility that makes someone capable of carrying a weapon. Now having covered that, I want to do something and I want to apologize to everybody in this room for doing so. I'm going to speak on the amendment, on the division. I know, I know, Senator Chambers is going to get upset, but here goes. Section 1 is the title. I think everyone understands that. Section 2 tells what they can do. Section 3, now we get into it, and those are the definitions.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR TYSON: Concealed means that a handgun is hidden from view, not partially hidden, partly hidden, or available to be seen when your coat is open; means that it is hidden from sight. Emergency services more or less speaks for itself, including both volunteer and paid, because in rural Nebraska volunteer fire departments are a very, very essential element of
