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North Dakota, South Dakota, Wyoming, Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Louisiana, I mean I can keep going, there's 32 states, and then there's another 11 states that have limited right to carry, which include Minnesota, Iowa, California, New York. Are we still talking the Wild West? I don't think so. Some of our friends in the casino corner went down to Nevada this weekend and that might be the Wild West to some still, but I'm pretty sure that nobody down there got held up by someone carrying a concealed weapon or any of those other issues. So the discussion doesn't seem to me right now to be leading toward the honest discussion of the bill. I think what Senator Tyson captured in his introduction is what we should be talking about and that is, is this a right that we should grant to the citizens of the state of Nebraska with proper checks and balances in place to ensure that law-abiding citizens that are responsible, that have the training and understanding of what it is that they are going to be entrusted with in the permit to carry a concealed weapon have. Now we can argue all over, day and night, about how many guns there are and what that means, because in my opinion, my humble opinion, I've only been on earth for 25 years, going to be 26 here in another week, but I have never in my life seen a gun walk into a room and shoot someone on its own, never. The reality is, is that someone has to be in hold of that gun. And what's being proposed to you under the committee amendments is the reality that there are certain opportunities that shouldn't be granted to everyone and that is our right, as government, to regulate what that looks like. But the underlying right of the opportunity shouldn't be infringed upon everyone, and I think that's responsible government. But again, it comes down to the underlying issue and that is, is that I think what's being proposed to us in the committee amendment, I think what's being proposed to us in the underlying bill is something that is reasonable, it's something that we have seen be productive, be cooperative. Senator Mossey talks about this, as a former law enforcement individual, about the opportunities that this has to help...
