Now we've got Senator "Bubba." There will be no more guns on the streets of Omaha or any other town than there are right now because you have to have a reason, not for the law, for yourself. Anybody with a developed sense of responsibility as a citizen is going to put himself under a burden to carry a gun. It's a responsibility. We have...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR TYSON: ...28-1202 now, and what this does, it regularizes, it codifies the situation so that law enforcement knows who is carrying a concealed weapon, has access to that information. It will be on the database in the Department of Motor Vehicles. And if you've got a...if you have answered the requirements of this act, you have a permit to carry it concealed, this doesn't excuse you from anything. If anything else, it makes your conduct more rigorously examined. So don't buy additional stock in gun companies or sporting goods stores. There is not going to be any big proliferation of guns. They are already there. Senator Thompson used the figure 65 million hand guns.

SPEAKER BROMM: Time. Thank you, Senator Tyson. Senator Hudkins.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I want to comment on Senator Kruse's hat. I thought he looked very dashing in it, and if his district doesn't feel that it's necessary for people in that area to carry concealed weapons, fine. They don't have to. A few years back my district also took a survey and the majority of those responses returned said, yes, we feel that you should be able to carry a concealed weapon. So it's probably, yes, it does depend upon the district, the experience of the people involved, and so many other factors. So I really don't think that all of our surveys together maybe would make a difference, but not individually. This bill provides for training in the safety use of a gun, also
