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is still off duty, he carries that gun all the time. And he is faced with situations that all of us are faced with as a civilian. And in that role, he never pulled his gun. That's the point that I was intending to make, that a person who legally can carry a pistol now concealed had no occasion to use it or pull it. Now this amendment that I'm offering is what I call truth in labeling. On page 1, in line 5, 6, and 8, I would strike the words "Concealed Handgun Permit" and insert in their place "Shoot Thy Neighbor and/or Thyself." This is an idiotic bill, idiotic. How many people on the floor are carrying pistols? What are you all so afraid of? Instead of terrorizing the people in your districts, you ought to be able to spread some calm, some intelligence, and some civilized thoughts. We all know that bad people carry guns. We all know that thieves steal. We know that bootlickers...bootleggers sell liquor illegally. We know that bootlickers cheese up to people and sell out. There is never going to be a total eradication of what society and individuals think is wrong. Jesus died, as I've told you all on numerous occasions, to save the whole world. And the world is not saved. In fact, it's growing worse. He came to eradicate sin, and there is more sin now than there ever was before. So if he can't do it, and he's supposed to be God, you know good and well that putting guns in people's hands is not going to stop crime. In many houses that are broken into, and the occupant is there and pulls a pistol, the gun usually is taken and used by the intruder. Officers who are trained have had their weapons taken from them and used on them and they are trained. Since Senator Mossey is a former police officer, I'd like to ask him another question or two that might bring enlightenment to all of us.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Mossey, would you yield?

SENATOR MOSSEY: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Mossey, you prevailed on Senator Tyson to put some requirements for training in this bill. You are not contending...well, let me ask it just as a straight question. Is it your contention that the training in this bill would equal that required of a police officer?
