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SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The next light on is Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. I'm...I had some things I wanted to talk about on this bill. But after I saw the amendment, I'm so taken aback I don't hardly know what to say. I mean, I don't...I guess changing the name of the bill is all right, but I hope we wouldn't carry it out, particularly about shooting thyself. I don't ever intend to do that. I've come close to it a couple of times, but never really was encouraged, at that point at least, to carry it out. I guess the issue that I had wanted to talk about, and will say just a few words about is some of the discussion I've heard today about the danger of guns and the amount of people who have had young people killed with guns, and issues along that line. The concern that I have is the guns are out there, folks. People have got guns. The question is whether you display them or whether you conceal them. Personally, I can't really understand what the difference is. There is one big difference, though. The big difference is, if you...if your gun is out in the open and you end up by leaving your vehicle for a little while and it's lying on your seat or on the dashboard, somebody's probably going to come along and steal it, and it will be somebody who doesn't deserve to have a gun. That's part of the issue that we're dealing with, as far as concealing the weapons that are people carrying. And I agree with the speakers before who talked about the fact that there are lots of guns out there that are not out in the open, that are concealed, and they're concealed for the purpose of people not wanting them to be stolen. I'm somewhat concerned about, if this issue has really turned to a point where maybe nobody should have a gun except police officers, if that's the direction we want to go. And I hear discussions along that line. Then, of course, that brings up a whole new issue. And I'd like to ask Senator Chambers a question.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Chambers, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.
