SENATOR TYSON: I'm on page 2 of the amendment, and I'm reading line 2.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right. Why are the words "any carrier enforcement officer" included?

SENATOR TYSON: Because they are a...now, members of the State Patrol.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So...

SENATOR TYSON: And as such, they are looked upon as sworn officers. I would think you would know that, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But Senator Tyson, on page 1 is the language "any officer of the Nebraska State Patrol". So aren't they covered under the words on page 1 in lines 22 and 23, "any officer of the Nebraska State Patrol"?

SENATOR TYSON: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So we don't really need that language. Would you agree? And this isn't a trick question.

SENATOR TYSON: Well, this just reinforces. That makes it redundant, but now everybody believes it, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I don't think it actually...thank you, that's all I need from you, Senator Tyson. I don't think it reinforces. I think there are things put down because we're not always attentive to what the law is already. And there are other things in this bill. I'm going to call them to people's attention. This is not a great bill. This is not a great amendment. The amendment is less obnoxious than the bill. But there are other things that need to be changed in this bill of that nature. I would like to ask Senator Brown a question, because she may be able to help me. Oh, she's not here? Oh, take your time, Senator Brown, because I'm not going anywhere.
