SENATOR BROWN:    Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    Senator Brown, does the term, when you're talking about eyesight, does the term "acuity" relate to how keen or good your eyesight is?

SENATOR BROWN:    Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    Is that the term, "acuity?" Thank you, that's all I will ask you.    members of the Legislature, on page 3, I look at some of the requirements that a person must meet in order to get one of these licenses to kill, or to maim himself, herself, or others.    Instead of "powers of eyesight"...for example, this is the statement: "An applicant shall possess the same powers of eyesight as required under section 60-" so forth.    I would rather see it say "visual acuity" instead of "powers of eyesight".    And some people may not see any reason to do that, and maybe I do.    But if we're going to do what needs to be done with this piece of proposed legislation, then there are changes that probably ought to be made.    I would like to ask Senator Tyson another question.

SPEAKER BROMM:    Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON:    If it's easy.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    Senator Tyson, this will be from page 3 of the amendment.    And I'm going to read the language, beginning in line 13.    And you can find it, but I'm going to read it.

SPEAKER BROMM:    One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    "When an applicant does not possess a current Nebraska motor vehicle operator's license, he or she shall demonstrate such powers of eyesight at the office of the county sheriff when applying for a permit".    How...what is...what means will the sheriff have to determine a person's visual acuity?    Is the sheriff to have equipment, or is he or she supposed to look at a person and know?
