SENATOR TYSON: Well, generally speaking, Senator Cham...Senator "Bubba,"...I slipped. I'm sorry.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Tyson, that I don't want you to do. That is a demeaning term, and I've never done something like that to you. I might call you "Baron," but I don't want any of those kind of terms applied to me on the floor, and I'd appreciate it. Over there when you were going out of the room, I didn't say anything because I thought you wouldn't add to it, and I thought you wouldn't do it. So I'm just saying that I'm a little sensitive with that term.

SENATOR TYSON: All right. I'll mention, Senator Chambers, that you are insulting my intelligence by the amendment you have on the floor right now. But I will answer your question.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, that doesn't...

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that doesn't apply to you personally. And you know the difference between it. And if you don't, I can explain it next time.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Mines.

SENATOR MINES: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. I rise in opposition to Senator Chambers' amendment. And I will support the committee amendment because, as Senator Chambers has stated, it's the least worst possible legislation. What I'm going to say here isn't going to matter. Everybody pretty much has their mind made up. But it's important to me that I get on the record what...where I'm at on this position. I was in the committee. I'm on the Judiciary Committee, and voted not to bring this bill to the floor. I have been lobbied heavily by those proponents of concealed carry, and very lightly by those that don't want people to carry concealed weapons. So I've...as I campaigned this past year, and most recently will ask people that I bump into, what do you think of concealed carry? Remember, my district is suburban Omaha and suburban Washington County. So when I posed the question, do you think concealed carry is a
