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SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...hidden? Where you going to hide it? Men can hide it down in their britches. Where's a woman going to hide a 16-inch barrel pistol? She say, well, I don't think I'll hide it; I'll just carry it where they can see it. Well, you can do that now, sister. This is foolishness. Sometimes you see things that will make you want to holler. You see other things like this that make you want to laugh. But it's so serious, you really can't, because people mean to try to get into law the foolishness contained in this bill. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the opening on FA1224 to FA1212 to LB 265. Open for discussion on that amendment. Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I would yield my time to Senator Jones.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jones, you have almost five minutes.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of the body, I haven't talked on this bill yet, but I wanted to get up and say a few things on it, because this has been tried three or four times in the Legislature. In fact, I was on the Judiciary Committee one time when we did move it out. And I took it as my priority bill one time too. And a lot of people in my district was wondering, how come you didn't get the bill passed, you know? If I remember right, we took a cloture vote, and we was two votes short because there was three or four people missing. So it's been here. And I sure hope that we can get it on through this time, because we're only a few...of a few states that don't have it. I know that. And really, guns don't shoot people; people shoot people. And a lot of people has brought that out already, and I think it's something we should remember. And don't matter whether we pass this bill or not; the criminals will always have the guns, and they'll always have them, even after we pass them. But this way, we can have a group of people that, after passing all the laws and everything that we can here, and the stipulation and regulations, can carry them legally. And I've got...in the constitution right now it says, the right to bear
