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SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Tyson.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: The one-half of fees shall be remitted to the county treasurer for deposit in the general fund of the county. And the one...the other half goes to the state treasury. And that 50 percent, that comes as of work of the county sheriff's department. But the fee part of it goes to the general fund of the county. So realistically, the sheriff's department is not credited for that money that is coming in. Is that correct, Senator Tyson?

SENATOR TYSON: That is correct. And if I could elaborate on that?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Yes, I will allow that.

SENATOR TYSON: I don't know about Platte County. And I know that you're a former Platte County...whether it's a supervisor or a commissioner.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Supervisor.

SENATOR TYSON: Supervisor. I know that in one county north of you, the three commissioners talk to the sheriff, and the sheriff talks to the three commissioners. And I'm sure that our sheriff will know to the penny what he's spending, and I know that he's going to go and he's going to ask for his money. And knowing the three commissioners very well, I think they're going to give it to him, even though they may argue a little bit to begin with. But I...rather than try to micromanage that, Senator Stuthman, we hit upon this. If it becomes a problem, we can go back and correct it. I have to tell you very honestly, I don't think it's a problem. I think that it's going to be reflected in the everyday workings of the county. Now, I realize as a former supervisor you may disagree with that.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: I necessarily don't disagree with that, because I do know that things can be worked out, because what money is generated by an entity is credited towards their budget the next year but, realistically, according to the records, it
