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adopt and promulgate rules and regulations. And the rules and regulations relate to carrying out the provisions of this bill. Then you go farther along, and in your wisdom you say, the State Patrol may promulgate and adopt rules and regulations to carry out the bill. So which is it? Do they have to, or are they free to ignore it? If we want the mandate to stand that you already have in this amendment, then get rid of Section 17 altogether, and just put in the one part of the bill the mandate, where you're talking about rules and regulations that have to be adopted. Then you have no problem. But if you want to make the umbrella farther in its reach, then in Section 17 on page 13, change the word "may" to "shall", so you have what is known as consistency. When the Legislature speaks twice on the same matter, the language the Legislature uses should be consistent. That means what you said at point A should be stated the same way at point B, since point A and point B are talking about the identical thing. It would be like me saying, and I have to give these analogies, because I don't know through explanation how to make it any clearer, the door shall be closed at all times, but the door may be left open. You don't...well, maybe you all do rear your children like that, and that's why the world and America is in such a mess. You order them to do something, and then right away tell them, but you don't really have to do it. We're not rearing children, brothers and sisters.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We are legislating. I'd like to ask Senator Tyson a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Tyson, would you yield?

SENATOR TYSON: Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Tyson, would you turn to page 5? And I...my light is on, because I may have to ask continue. I won't ask you right now, because there won't be enough time. Let me wait until my next time up. But what I'm discussing here is the existence of what I see as a contradiction. Oh, I said page 5? On page 3, if you look in line 21, you'll see, starting there
