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little difficult for...administratively. So I think it would be important to have the State Patrol take some leadership here in a lot of these requirements that are made of the sheriff, so that there's consistency around the state in who is being issued a permit, and also to help inform that process and train to that process. I think this is a section that's very difficult to work with. And getting back to Senator Stuthman's question before, maybe this section, where they're going to have to make a lot of judgment calls,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...we're going to say, well, you can't...you're not civilly liable. And I guess I have some problem with putting the sheriff's office in the...that decision making position in the first place. But in the second place, if they don't issue a permit, if they choose not to issue a permit, there are going to be costs to the county, because that can be appealed, and the sheriff or sheriff's deputy will have to be there in court, and it will take part of the court process to do that. So in another time, I'm going to talk a little bit more about county costs and some of the other issues in this bill. But at this point, I think it would be very helpful for the State Patrol to take the lead on this, not only in just a couple of areas, but in setting some statewide standards for how these situations are going to be handled. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, my amendment will not make the State Patrol do anything other than what they are to do based on what's in the bill. They already are mandated to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations governing handgun training and safety courses and so forth. And you'll find that on page 3, starting in line 21. I haven't had the opportunity to go through everything at this time that the State Patrol does, because I'm trying to craft my amendments to the divisions that we made in the bill. In some cases, the divisions involved sections that are not consecutive. So I cannot just look at one page and turn it over and have
