SENATOR CUDABACK:    One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    For sure.    And Section 5 gives quite a bit of direction, wouldn't you say, and guidance.

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    It gives, yes, relatively specific direction. But you also have to read the entirety of the act, as we say in the law, in pari materia. You read the whole thing. So I think the whole act provides guidance, particularly now that we didn't rename it the Shoot Your Neighbor and Yourself Act.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    (Laugh) Thank you, Senator Brashear.    And because the time is so short, I won't try to get any more in at this point.    Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Thank you, Senator Chambers.    Senator Burling, followed by Senator Thompson, Schimek, and Chambers.

SENATOR BURLING:      Thank you, Mr. President.    I'm standing to oppose the amendment, even though I don't know as it makes a whole lot of difference, as has already been said. But I'd like to ask Senator Tyson some questions, if he would yield.

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Senator Tyson, are you available for a question?    I do not see Senator Tyson on the floor, Senator,...

SENATOR BURLING:    There he is.

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Oh, there he is.    I'm sorry      I'm sorry.  
Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON:      Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR BURLING:    Senator Tyson, I learn by doing, so let's...if you would play with me a little bit here, why, let's play...let's pretend I'm the applicant, and I go into the county sheriff's office. And does he take my word for all of those qualifications in Section 6, or does he have a database to check it out?
