Senator Chambers.

SENATOR TYSON: Oh, thank you, Senator Cudaback. In the divided question, we spent some time yesterday debating a couple of Senator Chambers' motions, and where he intends to take FA1225 I really don't know. I spoke on that late yesterday afternoon, three o'clock something, and it appears to me to be one of these questions that go to the intent of the drafter of the bill, allowing some freedom of action on the basis...on the part of the State Patrol, allowing them, if they so deem it necessary for procedural purposes, to enact rules and regulations, and that's where we are now, up for discussion of the body, as it was yesterday.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Senator Brashear, do you have anything to add to our review?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, just trying to be helpful and supportive of the body's efforts, we're in the first division. This is Sections 1, 2, 3, and 17. It deals with the name, the definitions and the like of the bill. We are pending on the first division as far as the committee amendment is concerned. And more specifically on Senator Chambers' amendment, which we've all spoken to, the first amendment, his first amendment we adopted. That was the right thing to do. I don't think it's essential in this case and there's a reason for drafting it with the permissive rather than the obligatory and mandatory language, but that's a question for the body. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Chambers, do you have anything to add, too, on your amendment? Thank you. We would now go to discussion of the Chambers amendment, FA1225, to FA1212, the first component of the divided committee amendment to LB 265. First speaker is Senator Foley, followed by Senator Chambers. Senator Foley.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you very much, Mr. President, members of the body. Yesterday, in one of his early speeches, Senator Chambers made a passing reference to me and said that he was surprised that Senator Foley was supporting this bill. And it is true that I did vote in committee to advance the bill, but my
