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SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. Thank you, Mr. President and members. I would like to give some of my time to Senator Raikes, in the hopes that he will then return the remainder of it to me. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Senator Schimek. I did get the hint there. I'll try to be quick. The fourth main reason that I was addressing was, concealed carry will reduce crime. And the idea is this. If you carry unconcealed, you're safe. Everybody can see that you've got a weapon there, and which, by the way, is legal, and you don't have to worry about crime. If it's concealed, if you allow concealed carry, then the bad guy has to guess. And the bad guy, being not that brave, or a coward, will pick easier targets, I guess, or simply the crime will go down as a result of that. But the idea is that people who don't carry handguns, concealed handguns, are more or less free riders on those that do carry. But my question is this. If that's the case, why would you prohibit concealed carry in a church? You're going to increase crime in churches. And as a matter of fact, let me suggest this. If you want to convince me that this is a good idea, go to a state that has adopted this. And I think most of them have excluded churches. Show me that after the introduction of this measure crime rates went up in churches, and I'm on your side, I'm a believer. Finally, along the lines of where you're not going to allow it, is to not allow it in legislative hearings. My concern with that is simply this. You, as an elected politician, elected political leader, are going to protect yourself in a hearing from someone having a handgun. But some young mother, say, with a couple of kids, in a grocery store, is going to be out there with the handguns. If I can be convinced on these points, I'll certainly listen, maybe even change my vote. But I don't see the reason why this is a good policy. Thank you, Senator Schimek, and I'll return your time.
