SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President, and thank you, Senator. I really turned on my light to try to express what you just did, and I would not have done nearly as good a job. That's why I wanted to give you the rest of my time. I'm not sure I think that it is...that the onus is on people who don't support the bill. I really believe that the onus, Senator Foley, is on those who are in favor of the bill and it is up to them to convince this body that this would be good state policy and that the bill has merit. And I do believe that some attempt has been to make this bill better than we've had in years before, but I don't believe that I'm convinced that this would be good state policy. And I'm not the most rational person on this bill. I mean, I told you yesterday I have almost a visceral kind of reaction to this bill. I just...I do not see the need for it. I do not see how it will improve our lives in this state and, in fact, I think it can make the lives of Nebraskans much worse. And I want to follow up on what Senator Raikes said. How do we deal with all of these places...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...where we have made exceptions to concealed carry, for instance, the Legislature itself? Are we going to have checkpoints where people have to check their guns? Is that the idea? Do we have to have then some kind of a scanning system so that we make sure that nobody comes into the Capitol with guns? What do we do at the football stadium? What do we do in all the other public places where people could possibly be taking guns? Now, I don't know, maybe that's not...that problem isn't envisioned by the sponsors of this bill, but if people are used to concealed carry I am sure that without thinking they are going to be carrying into places where there are large numbers of people. I just don't understand why we need this bill. I think that's the most cogent...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...argument. There hasn't been a need presented, to me at least.
