SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, there is a provision in this bill that is found beginning in line 26 on page 7. It talks about a sheriff issuing a permit under this act, and it says: No sheriff who issues a permit under the Concealed Handgun Permit Act is civilly liable to any injured person or his or her estate for any injury suffered, including any action for wrongful death or property damage suffered, relating to the issuance or revocation of the permit. I'd like to ask Senator Tyson a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Tyson, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR TYSON: Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Tyson, this provision that I'm talking about on pages 7 and 8 do not say that the sheriff has to issue the permit in compliance with the requirements of the act; yet, he or she gets total immunity. Is that your intent, that the sheriff can ignore the requirements of the act, issue...

SENATOR TYSON: Senator Chambers, can you let me catch up here? I was talking about something else to somebody else.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, okay. I'll start again.

SENATOR TYSON: Page 7 and 8?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Page 7, at the bottom. It's starting in line 26, and I will state what it is I'm looking at and I hope you'll take my word that I'm giving it to you accurately.

SENATOR TYSON: No, I'm reading that now and I'm familiar with that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. There is nothing anywhere in that language of Section 9 that says a sheriff who issues this permit must do so in conformity with. It just says under the Concealed Handgun Permit Act. Now the sheriff, under this language, could
