isn't just to have a gun but to keep others in the dark, including innocent parties, hosts, coworkers, people on the street. Your right affects my safety because you are concealing...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...a risk to me. You are concealing a significant risk that I, I think, ought to know about. Look if it's your right to carry the gun, isn't it my right to know that the gun exists so that I can either absent the place because I don't want to be there, walk out of the room, ask you to leave my home, ask you to leave my business? Shouldn't I have that corresponding right? This is not about the power to bear arms. This is about the power to conceal that fact from wrongdoers, but also from other people who are innocent bystanders who don't want to be in the presence of guns. Are they now deceived by those who carry guns? Yes, they are; however, the people who are deceiving them now are breaking the law. I find that they are two rights that are bumping up against each other--your right to carry weapons, which by the way I think it secured by your right to get a permit...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...to carry and to show them to the world; and my right not to be deceived and placed at risk by you, unknowingly, because you won't tell me.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Mines, followed by Senator Erdman.

SENATOR MINES: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I yield my time to Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you have almost five minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Mines. Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, I want to compile a record. This bill grants the sheriff total immunity, period.
