been in effect since 1987 and some of the permits issued under this bill, when it's passed this session, will be revoked because people and systems are not perfect. I realize that there are people here who think that by passing legislation we can perfect mankind, but that hasn't worked too well either. There is something, though, that's within this bill that I think you should have your attention called to, and that's the reason that I'm speaking this time. There is a safety training requirement in this bill to be designed by the director of public safety, who is the colonel commanding the State Patrol or his designee. It will, it must by this statute, include instruction in when you are permitted to, under the law, the use of deadly force. Now, I am not an attorney and I'm not going to give you a long song and dance about the use of deadly force. The force continuum is something that I have studied, but I don't know what the course is going to include. However, if you do something, if you act with the gun that this will allow you to carry concealed, and what you do is not correct under the law, you're going to have something that we call a trial. And under the law, if you have not acted within the law, in other words if the situation was not as you saw it, in a split second, there are going to be people, judges and lawyers and juries, that are going to take their time examining what you did and you can be found guilty and you can be sent to prison. That is what people that are carrying concealed nowadays can look forward to as well. This...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR TYSON: ...extends a right you have. It does not extend to where you can injure the rights of someone else; was never meant to. This law has a balanced approach to instruction, but the instruction is to primarily how do you handle a firearm safely in all aspects and when can you use it. I don't think a lot of people who are going to carry a concealed weapon are going to use it. Most never will. I don't know what percentage, 99 percent, 99.99. This is a safeguard. It is not an answer to everyone's problems. So look at the matter contained in the bill as to...
