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Nebraska where EMS is often the first responder and they do have to secure the firearms before law enforcement arrives. So this isn't something new that just came about. It doesn't happen all the time, but it does happen. And with those arguments, I guess the only other point I'd like to make is when... Senator Chambers had talked about, if a person didn't have a driver's license on them. In law enforcement, we can verify whether a person has a driver's license or not. So that, I don't see that as a big issue, sticking point in the bill. And to make one other point, I'd like to, I guess, address real quick. For every point that's been pointed about what bad has come about with concealed weapons, it could be counterpointed with good. I know of instances in some states where police officers' lives have been saved because of the carry concealed weapon laws. People's lives have been saved. There was an incident in McDonald's where a person came in and did an armed robbery, shot a person. A person in that establishment was carrying a concealed weapon and shot that person and killed them and saved everybody in that McDonald's. With that, I'll yield the rest of my time to Senator Tyson if I have any remaining.

SPEAKER BROMM PRESIDING

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Mossey. Senator Price.

SENATOR PRICE: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I am going to be voting against all the amendments, and look at each amendment, and then voting against the bill. I visited with a man outside the building this morning and he holds a concealed carry permit from the state of Arizona, showed me his permit that he has to renew every four years after he takes 16 hours of training, and then he goes through a background check, and he was lobbying me for permitting this in Nebraska. It isn't going to work. But he is a good responsible guy, but I don't believe that a person needs to carry a concealed weapon unless you're in law enforcement or in security. I will admit that when I was a girl growing up on the farm, I was a pretty good shot with a .22 rifle. You know, we used watermelons. We used a pile of rotten eggs on a straw bale. I was a pretty good shot. I enjoyed it. But I never did hunt. And...oh, you're looking at me like I'm a western woman there, Cunningham. But my concern is road rage.
