Somebody said, why do you support this? I don't know. It won't change five of our habits, 5 percent of our habits. I don't know why I support this. Maybe I'm wrong. Maybe, but right now I support it. Can you imagine what would have happened, let's say we didn't have the current law on the books where you can carry a weapon now. Currently, and we have...and I have people in my district, have one around the Gibbon area, have several in the Kearney area, several around that carry a gun on their hips. We don't think anything about it. But can you imagine what would happen if Senator Connealy introduced legislation to allow us to carry a weapon on our hips? Can you imagine what would happen? Why you'd think the earth was falling or however that saying goes. Can you imagine what would take place on this floor or in Nebraska if we introduced a bill to allow us to carry a gun in the open? Why it would be absolutely catastrophe. What...and that is the current law. Is it a catastrophe? We don't even think about it. We do not think about it. It does not change our habits. I don't go around doing it. You don't go around doing it. Some do, and that's fine. The same way with this bill here. If this bill passes, if it happens to pass, and, again, I really don't care. At this stage I really don't care. I'm going to support it, but I don't really care. I'm not going to, you know, have any nightmares over not passing. But the point is it won't change any of our habits. I called Texas. I called Texas. I have a friend down there. I says, do you have the right to carry a concealed weapon? He said, gee, do we, I don't really know. I don't really know. And that's the way it is. It doesn't change our habits. But I guess if there is one thing that might make me vote for it more than not voting for it, it's the fact that if you want to you can.
