Columbine incident, and if I...if my informat'ion is correct, a weapon that is...it's been modified since it was used, but it's called the Intra Tec AB-10 9 millimeter. It's under the 16 inch allowable length for concealed weapons, which is in this bill. It is a semiautomatic weapon, five inch barrel, 12.5 inches overall. And I under...I don't know the allowable limit on clips that go into this AB-10 weapon but it will accommodate 32 or 50 shot magazines, and then I would hope that those are illegal at the federal level. But, nonetheless, this weapon is easily concealed under one's coat, But what I found really interesting is the Desert Mark IX, Desert Eagle handgun made by IMI. This is a 10.75 inch weapon. You can conceal it. It comes in a number of versions; a .357 magnum, a .44 magnum, and a .50 caliber. Now I wish I could show you, all of you, the size of the .50 caliber round in comparison to a 9 millimeter. It's huge. I might mention that this weapon is the primary handgun of the Israeli Army, and now the statement here is the IMI is quite possibly one of the most powerful handguns in the world. Now I'm not suggesting that all the good guys will run out and buy the IMI Desert Eagle, and I'm not suggesting that the bad guys carry them either. I'm suggesting that allowing a 16 inch barrel on any weapon just says to me that you can carry incredible firepower, the option for an unseen discharge or for any of the road rage or any of the things we've talked about is certainly an option. And when you're carrying weapons like these, it's very scary and I just...I am concerned that, in fact, this is not a good thing for Nebraska. Finally, Senator Mossey suggested that the rank and file in the Omaha Police Department are in favor of conceal carry, and that their chief isn't, and he doesn't represent the rank and file. I, you know, I just have to say he is the chief officer of that department. It does carry some weight. His opinion does carry weight. And in the department where I live, in Blair, I asked the lieutenant there, if this is approved, will conceal carry weapons make your job easier? And he gave me that look like, are you nuts?
